PROGRAM: Randy Knowles spoke on public access to public lands and easements. The political climate in the legislature is to follow public opinion. The Dana Ranch is a good example of the problem of private, BLM, DRNC lands being in a chunk. Getting easements to the public portions have to be worked out to everyone's benefit. Then the easement is forever, no time limit. A power company would have a lease for the easement that would expire. Other states are passing 'green' laws. Turns coal plants into natural gas plants. Cleaner burning, less pollution. In Montana, you not only own your land, but the air above it. Montana is unique in this respect. The constitution states that all wildlife is public. FWP rangers are paid from the number of licenses that are sold to the public. 60% of the land in Montana is public. There is a group called PLWA for \$20 a year, that will help give you a voice in keeping public lands public.
