Trayson's liver enzymes are still high so they are delayed coming home but his blood cells are hanging in there so there haven't been any transfusions since August. They are looking into being back mid-February/March but they will need to go back to Denver every month for checkups. The CMR Rustlers and GFHS Bison have chosen Trayson to be the face of their campaign to spread awareness about a seemingly unknown and silent killer, Sickle Cell Disease. The student group formerly called HOSA, Health Occupation Students of America, is now referred to as Future Health Professionals. WINE & FOOD FESTIVAL: Dallas Lopez announced 35th Annual on February 27 at the Heritage Inn. Will have more info closer to the date. Will need volunteers and sponsors for the auction. PROGRAM: Benefis Foundation presented by Sara Branson. The Foundation helps several organizations throughout the community. One is the Angel Fund. Families are awarded \$750 towards travel to get the pediatric patient out to Seattle or down to Salt Lake or wherever. Angel Fund is usually helping kids that need to be out on a flight immediately. The Foundation also provides scholarships for students throughout the State for schooling

in any of the medical services. The Foundation also handles the Safety First Rally that helps provide helmets and other safety equipment for bike safety. Helmets are fitted per child. Pediatric head injury has decreased due to program. This has expanded to ski helmets for young skiers.

Sara also helps with the Gift of Life Housing. This housing give families a place that is safe and close to facilities for Cancer patients. Chemo patients are able to stay over night and have their treatments, instead of having to drive several miles out of town while not feeling well. There are two sets of units now, one by West Campus, a new one by East Campus. There are also RV hookups that allow pets. It is a free situation that helps families that are already in financial stress due to the illness. This is available due to great donors.

Drs. Sotioropoulos have helped start a program for reading. When a child is born, they are given a book at every 6 month well child exam that is age appropriate. It has been found to help promote talking and socialization of the children.

Hospice House was the first in Montana. This is a place for people at the end of life disease to have a homey place where nursing care is available. Being close to Benefis and Great Falls Clinic, patients are able to see their doctors when needed. The House has increased in size. All funds are from donations.

Camp Francis is magic. It is for children 10-13 that have had a family loss. This is a no charge camp with various mental health professionals to help the children learn to cope with the death. It has helped many children regain their childhood. There is also a retreat for older children.

The Foundation can also give money to the community thru various local organizations. Quality Life needed CPR dummies that receptive to pressure, Foundation provided the funds necessary. Neighborhood Works has had a need for wheelchair ramps, The Foundation was able to help with the funds. There are many others that have received assistance.

Uptown provided \$25000 for the Children's Corner of Sletten Cancer. Travis Harp's grandfather's passing is immortalized at Hospice with the stained glass Wheat window. (Travis' dad made the window). David and Sara Robbin were just at Hospice for David's mom's passing. David let us know that Respite Care is available. Ev Hall has seen the ski helmets up at Showdown on children's heads.
